Future Leadership Announces New Leadership Team

On April 6, the Foundation's Board of Directors unanimously selected Rev. Greg Morrow, Ph.D., as its next executive director. Rev. Morrow has served as the Foundation's Chief Operating Officer since 2014. He has also served as Pastor at First Baptist Church, California, Mo., since 1997 until his retirement in September 2016.



Morrow replaces the organization's first executive director and co-founder Roger Hatfield, who retired in September.

"Greg is passionate about missions and specifically about training future Christian ministry leaders in the direction of God's call," said Gerri Ogle, Future Leadership Foundation Board President. "We are thankful for Greg's call and willingness to lead our ministry."

Morrow received his PhD in Rural Sociology and International Development from the University of Missouri in May.

SBU Leads Youth Camp in Lithuania for Second Year

Lithuanian leaders are preparing to host a youth camp for the second year in a row. Last year, under the direction of Southwest Baptist University (Bolivar, Mo.) and FLF, Lithuania hosted its first youth camp in five years.

This year's event is scheduled for July 12-31 at Wesley Camp in Lipaja, Latvia. Heading up the preparation for FLF are Ed Walton, Director of Libraries at SBU, and his wife, Tina Walton, working with local leaders Dana Podriabinkina and Henrikas Zukauskas. A team of six SBU students will join the Waltons in this initiative.



The efforts aim to continue developing youth ministers in the Baptist Union of Lithuania. We will train and equip pastors identified as effective

leaders, so they can organize summer camps and enhance youth and children's ministries in their churches to reach children and youth for Christ.



Ministry and Collaboration Explored at European Summit



FLF will have a great representation at the first European Summit in June, held at Ukraine Baptist Theological Seminary, L'viv. Nine FLF staffers and board members will attend the Summit June 2-15, which includes meetings at the seminary, the Baptist Union in Kyiv, and the Baltic States. The summit will explore further ministry and collaborative opportunities with FLF's European partners.

In addition to the FLF team, local leaders will attend from numerous eastern European countries, including the Russia Federation, Ukraine, Belarus, Moldova, Romania, Poland and Armenia. Separate staff visits to Estonia and Lithuania will conclude the Summit.

FLF will help the partners assess their needs and develop specific project and partnership requests.

The FLF team will present these project ideas to the FLF board at its October 2017 meeting.

iPad Initiative Nearing Completion (With a Little Help From Our Friends)

The iPad Initiative is nearing completion! Last Fall, FLF purchased 290 used iPads from William Jewell College at \$125 each. A partnership was fostered with Minsk Theological Seminary and Ukrainian Baptist Theological Seminary to provide iPads to enhance theological education for students.

The cost of the iPad was shared evenly between FLF, the seminaries and the students. Students were able to purchase the iPads for approximately \$40 each.

The interesting part of this project has been getting the iPads to Belarus and Ukraine. The most efficient and effective way of transporting them is through friends traveling there on mission. FLF missionaries and friends from Missouri, Louisiana, Georgia and Texas have partnered to carry the iPads. FLF received a big boost when the Singing Men of Texas took 136 on their tour to Ukraine. The final twenty-seven iPads will arrive via FLF leaders participating in the European Summit in June. What a great opportunity to celebrate the successful end of the iPad Initiative!

Once again the FLF mission has been accomplished through the partnerships within the larger body of Christ to strengthen the ministries and missions of our brothers and sisters around the world!

Distance Learning Makes Youth Conference Possible in Belarus

28 students in Belarus attended an FLF-led distance learning event in April. Drs. Keith Krispin and David Sanders, instructors at Judson University, Chicago, conducted "Youth Ministry in the Church," an online course April 7-8. We provided this teaching program for students at the Minsk Theological Seminary's Pastoral Ministry program.



The attendees expressed appreciation for our American professors' generosity and willingness to share their expertise. They especially valued the discussion about the different stages of adolescence and how they come into play for youth ministers.

Because this was an online course, presenters, local leaders and students had a chance to provide valuable feedback for our distance learning process and make recommendations for future uses. While this event spanned two days, future online learning could include a more focused approach, such as a two-hour course on a specific topic.
