Field Service Directors John Jackson and Dr. John Claydon will be preaching in local churches.

In England, Claydon and Jackson will meet with the Regional Pastor for the Northern Baptist Association, along with FLF Executive Director Greg Morrow via Skype. The meeting will discuss Claydon's new role as a member of the FLF Lithuania Field Service Team; and debrief the Lithuanian retreat, strategizing possible future involvement by FLF with the Lithuanian leadership.



July 22 – 26 El Salvador Leadership Training

El Salvador Baptist Convention Board of Directors, Baptist Theological Institute of El Salvador Board of Directors, pastors and leaders are coming together for teaching and coaching.

Heber Mena will serve as team leader in providing leadership training, and leadership coaching for about 45 board members and pastors based on John C Maxwell's "15 Invaluable Laws of Leadership" & "Becoming a Person of Influence." He will also meet with leadership to plan for 2020.

Meanwhile, Paul Calmes, an adjunct professor at Oklahoma Baptist University in Shawnee, Okla., will teach hermeneutics courses to 50 pastors in the West (Ahuachapán), Central (San Salvador) and East (Usulután) zones in El Salvador.



September 9 – 17 Poland Partnership Exploration

A team of 12 American church leaders, led by Team Leaders Calvin Brown, Chris Cook and Steve Easterwood will tour Poland and fellowship with national pastors for mutual encouragement and exploring future partnership opportunities.



October 9 – 16 Ukraine Teaching and Pastor's Conference

Calvin Brown will lead a team who will be teaching students at Ukraine Baptist Theological Seminary, followed by a two-day pastor's conference for what is projected to be more than 150 pastors and church leaders.

El Salvadoran Leaders Receive First Theological Training in

An FLF-sponsored team headed to El Salvador in February to provide Baptist theological training. led by Heber Mena and Verlyn Bergen, both of Jefferson City, Mo.

"There has been no formal Baptist theological education in El Salvador since the revolution in the 1980s," said Verlyn *(pictured below, right)*. In fact, "only about 10 percent of the Baptist pastors there have any theological education."

Most of the pastors enrolled in these courses are past the age of returning to theological seminary. "We are honored to assist... these underprivileged pastors and church leaders," added Verlyn.

Verlyn and Heber worked with the Association of Baptists of El Salvador to provide six courses for

local pastors. A pilot course for this program was led in May 2018 by Dr. Kelly Malone of Southwest Baptist University in Bolivar, Mo.

An FLF team will provide another course this July *(see page 2)*, followed by two courses each year through 2021.

Mike Haynes, director of the Greene County Baptist Association, and his wife Robbi *(far right)* led the mission, joined by Rev. Dan and wife Julie Swadley, pastor at Brookline Baptist Church.



Both couples serve in Springfield, Missouri. They held the training at the University of Divine Grace in Chisinau, Moldova's capital city. Moldova is located between Ukraine and Romania in Eastern Europe.

The FLF team had four specific goals for their weeklong project:

- Support and encouragement of pastors and their wives serving in Moldova
- Understand needs for future engagement opportunities with Moldova Baptist Union
- · Relationship building with pastors and wives

· Encouraging and training students

Robbi says all the attending pastors and wives

are bivocational. Some maintain a greenhouse or small garden to supplement their family's budget.

"For pastors and wives to come to Chisinau and stay at UGD was a real blessing to them," Robbi said. "Many of the couples never had two nights away from home in that type of setting. The pastors said they left feeling renewed



and encouraged by the training and fellowship."

Mike says there is much more work to be done in Moldova. While in the area, they drove through a town just outside Chisinau with a population of 10,000 unserved by a church or witnesses.
