Redundant as it may sound, 2020 has been a year like no other. Who could have foreseen the disruption resulting from a worldwide pandemic? Nevertheless, as someone once observed, opportunities often come wrapped up in a problem.

Beginning in March, travel restrictions hindered in-person interaction with

our international partners. Still, FLF staff found new opportunities to interface with our global leaders by focusing on relationship building through enhanced communication by email, and virtual meetings. The goal was to "minister to those who minister" by communicating that *they are as important to us as is the work we do with them.* FLF staff also made good use of this time to enact alternate methods of delivering services; a process that has led to some exciting teaching opportunities.

An opportunity to further discussion about FLF's future development at a three-day board/staff retreat planned for August was postponed due to meeting restrictions. Our board and staff were, however, able to meet one day virtually, interacting with retreat leaders Mark and Linda Whitworth, former missionaries with the International Mission Board. Plans remain active to reschedule this event in 2021, continuing our conversations about the future and how we might better plan for delivery of services, especially in a post COVID-19 world.

Good news for FLF was highlighted by yet another opportunity due to your faithful support. We remain grateful and blessed that our donor base has remained both faithful and generous throughout 2020.

Read more about how funds were dispersed to partners in 2020 on page 3. None of this would be possible without the support of FLF donors like you. Based on the recommendations of Field Service staff working with international partners, FLF forwarded approximately \$9,150 in support of ministry projects that were able to take place with FLF interaction, either in-person or online. An additional \$16,000 was forwarded to Ukraine Baptist Theological Seminary, designated for the Macedonia Project to support church planting, with \$8,000 still to be sent before the end of the year. None of these funds could have been forwarded without the support of FLF donors.

For so many around the world, 2020 has been a year of public conflict, private anguish, and personal loss. Yet, we are reminded that in the midst of so much chaos, our Lord remains sovereign, unchanged by the challenges we face. That is the point, isn't it? For therein lies the relevance of God's Word from one generation to the next. As it was for those to whom the Apostle Paul wrote, so it remains for us today.

Problems? Yes. Opportunities? Yes, and more! "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose... For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 8:28; 38-39).

Ukraine: Church Planters Retreat

In February, three FLF trainers traveled to Ukraine to participate

in the Church Planters Retreat at Ukraine Baptist Theological Seminary (UBTS) in L'viv.

Jason Gentry (team coordinator), Dale Baker, and Stefan Gerville led the training of 17 church planters in 21 hours of formal teaching, as well as informal interaction accentuated by the setting which took place in the Carpathian Mountains. Jason's report captured the essence of this important event with highlights, such as: *"The relationship with them deepened beyond the professional to a brotherhood";*. "This investment of time was priceless"; *"It was so very touching and humbling... I feel these* guys taught me more than I them."

Our service work in 2020 has taken a different path than anticipated due to COVID, however, our commitment to developing Christian leaders globally is stronger than ever. Prior to COVID restrictions in March, we were able to facilitate two trips for training of leaders.

Theological Education of Pastors, El Salvador



Heber Mena, a member of the Central America Field Service team, enlisted Pastor Luis Mendoza to conduct theological education of pastors, leading

> to a certificate of training presented by FLF, the Association of Baptists in El Salvador (ABES), and the Institute of Theology of Baptists in El Salvador (ITBES).

Ukraine: Mission Students Retreat

In October, three FLF trainers participated virtually in a Missions Retreat hosted by Ukraine Baptist Theological Seminary (UBTS) in L'viv. Calvin Brown, Heber Mena, and Stuart Doyle provided four virtual classes via Zoom in various topics to instruct nearly 25 seminary students in the missions department at the seminary.

Courses taught as requested by UBTS included Cross-Cultural Witnessing, the Character of God's Servants, Team Building, and Serving with Multicultural Teams.

The content was well-received by both students and staff and created good discussion after the virtual training. And while in-person training is preferred by all, the objectives and goals for this virtual training were met and celebrated.

As one student said, "It's best to have face-toface training, but for lack of opportunity, it was a wonderful time in its own way!"

Another student shared, "Thank God for the wonderful opportunity to learn together, even if the teacher is through Zoom."

A request has been made to continue this work in 2021 as FLF and UBTS continue to partner together to develop Christian leaders globally.

Underwrote February's Church Planters Retreat at the Ukraine Baptist Theological Seminary.

\$442.50

Underwrote the theological education of pastors in February with the Association of Baptists in El Salvador (ABES), and the Institute of Theology of Baptists in El Salvador (ITBES). **\$5,000** Wired to the Baptist Union of Poland designated for the installation of a furnace for the Zelow Baptist Church. This church is the focus of the Church Revitalization Project approved by the board in November 2019. Funds for the project were taken from donations directed to the Poland Leadership Training Account received from Parkade Baptist Church, Columbia, MO and a private contribution from a member of the same church.

\$16,000

Released to Ukraine Baptist Theological Seminary. These funds are designated for the Macedonia Project, a church planting initiative begun in 2013 partnering American pastors and churches with Ukrainian church plants. A final disbursement will be approved prior to December 31 for a total of **\$24,000** disbursed for the year. \$1,000

Wired to Ukraine Baptist Theological Seminary, partially support of the UBTS Missions Department Retreat in October.
