International Conference Scheduled in 2023

Imagine a time where Christian leaders from throughout the world can gather to worship, network, and plan with one another.

Imagine a place where participants find ways to combine their individual strengths to make a difference that can last, not for a few days, but for months, even years into the future.

Imagine if the resources of Future Leadership Foundation could be utilized to make such a meeting not just a dream, but a *possibility*.

Global leaders are beginning to put into place plans for a conference called *Celebrating Partners, Creating Partnerships: Sowing Sustainable Seeds*, to be held June 2023 in Warsaw, Poland. As the title implies, the goal is to sow sustainable seeds for the future. Existing and possible new partners would participate alongside other Christian leaders.

Who would participate?

• FLF Family, staff and Field Service Directors, with travel and in-country costs to be covered. (Board member would pay their own expenses.)

• Those that may become 'New' Partners. For these participants the conference itself will be free, though not travel and other costs. The possibility of scholarships may be available on a case-by-case basis.

• **Invitees,** who may be church leaders and others who have expressed interest in the FLF mission. These would be responsible for their own travel and in-country costs.





This dream is built on past successes. In 2017, FLF invited leaders from eight countries to a summit in Ukraine, introducing FLF leaders to our international partners while building relationships and dreaming of the future. This initial meeting resulted in much of the work FLF is doing today.

A similar conference initially planned for this year was postponed due to COVID and the uncertainty of international conflict.

FLF believes the time is right to re-engage with our international partners in our common cause to develop Christian leaders globally.

A benefit of this meeting in Warsaw makes it more centrally located for many of our partners, making travel more feasible.
